BRIEFLY SUMMARIZE THE ESTABLISHMENT AND DEVELOPMENT OF THE AGENCY

On May 3, 1946, President Ho Chi Minh signed Decree No. 58 establishing the Ministry of Home Affairs, including many agencies, including the Department of Ethnic Minorities; The functions and tasks of the Department of Ethnic Minority Affairs are defined in the Decree Uncle Ho signed as "considering political and administrative issues pertaining to ethnic minorities in the country and tightening the friendly relationship between the ethnic minorities in the country." people living in Vietnam". Thus, only one year after the birth of the Democratic Republic of Vietnam (September 2, 1945), a specialized agency for ethnic affairs was established. To carry out this important task, since then, the Party, National Assembly and Government all have specialized agencies to study, monitor and advise and direct the implementation of ethnic affairs. Ethnic affairs agencies in each revolutionary period, although with different names, aim to well implement the Party's policy of great national unity. To meet the requirements of ethnic work in the new period, the Prime Minister signed Decision No. 1491/QD-TTg, dated October 14, 2008 taking May 3 every year as the day "Traditions of the agency" State management in the field of ethnic affairs".

In Binh Phuoc province, before 1997, the Committee for Ethnic Minority Affairs was under Song Be Provincial Party Committee. After re-establishing the province, on November 15, 2000, Binh Phuoc Provincial People's Committee issued Decision No. 104/2000/QDUBND to establish the Provincial Committee for Ethnic Minority and Religion, with the function of advising the Provincial Party Committee and Provincial People's Committee. on guidelines and policies for ethnic minorities and help the Provincial People's Committee perform state management in the field of ethnic affairs and religious activities in the province. Binh Phuoc has a border with the Kingdom of Cambodia and has a large number of ethnic minorities living together (41 ethnic groups). In the past, this place was also a fierce battlefield. Under the leadership of Party committees at all levels, the management and administration of local authorities, socio-economic (socio-economic) areas of ethnic minority and mountainous areas of the province have gradually stabilized and developed, infrastructure floors are improved, the material and spiritual life of ethnic minorities is constantly being improved.

Looking back at the history of the nation's struggle for independence under the leadership of the Party and Uncle Ho, the Vietnamese people in general and Binh Phuoc province in particular have made great contributions with the strength of the Vietnamese people.
